# REPUBLICAN PARTY OF SAINT LUCIE COUNTY EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MINUTES APRIL 13, 2021

- Call to order occurred at 6:36

- 3. Pledge of Allegiance was led by Chairman Nail
- 4. Opening comments offered by Chairman Nail:

Subject: Strengthen Election Reform Bill SB90

The Florida Legislature is in week 7 of 9 and election reform still has not passed Senate Bill 90 which advances election reforms such as strengthening voter ID on vote-by-mail ballots and limits ballot harvesting, but it could be even better!

SB90 should also include:

- 1. Observation of absentee ballot signature verification process
- 2. A prohibition of funding local election offices by third parties which can lead to abuse and conflicts of interest.

Below is the list of senators who are on the rules committee who will be meeting on Wednesday. Here is the script that need to be forwarded to all of these Senators:

You are on the rules committee and will be discussing SB-90 at your next meeting. This bill needs to be strengthened by adding language that was in HB 7041 when it was passed out of committee. The language to allow third parties to observe and challenge phony ballots was in the original HB 7041. This language was stricken when the bill was presented to the house appropriations committee.

Without language to allow third parties to see and challenge a ballot during the signature match process of vote by mail, any bill passed will not contain any teeth or have any ability for immediate enforcement.

Please add the HB 7041 language that was stricken, to SB-90 and allow evidence to be created that will bring integrity and transparency to our Florida elections. If not, we run the risk of becoming Georgia.

Contact members of the Senate Rules Committee NOW and urge them to add these two provisions into SB90, and then vote YES to SB90 on Wednesday!
