Meeting called to order by Chairman Kenny Nail at 6:05 pm

1. Chairman Nail's Message:

- a. Chairman Nail applauded the House Speaker process this last session. The House was given back to the people with the concessions the 20 Republicans were able to secure
- b. Chairman Nail highlighted the Voter Registration Events results:
 - i. In the last 3 months, Republicans gained 2004 more registrations
 - ii. As of the meeting, Republicans are only 4940 registrations behind the Democrats
- c. The 2nd Annual America First Clay Shoot was held Saturday the 14th and was a resounding success. Mike & Amy Decker and the volunteers they were able to secure did a great job. The event doubled earnings over last year's event
 - i. Treasurer Russell Ansley shared that the next Clay Shoot is Jan. 27, 2024
 - ii. Treasurer Russell Ansley shared we brought in \$42,500 and after expenses the REC will net approximately \$22k
 - 1. We had 84 shooters compared to 94 last year
